

Johnson was not known to have heart condition.

The popular, quiet, mild-manwas the son of the late William R. and Hattie Honeycutt Johnson of Wendell.

He graduated from Wendell High School and had a year of college at Trinity (now Duke University). He was also a graduate of Koster School of Design of Chicago.
