

The proposed water plant was to be on property to be purchased from Wilbur Bullock. The site is located on the Wendell-Zebulon

Bullock indicated in the beginning when contacted by the mayor and commissioners about the site that he was willing to sell the twoacre plot to the town for the erection of the water plant.

Now, however, Mayor Hales said last week, Bullock has changed his mind. Mayor Hales did not reveal Bullock's reasons for declining to sell the property.

Bullock was to be paid approximately \$3,000 an acre for the land.
