F., 12" Water Line, 2,000 L. F. 10" Water Line, and 800 L. F. 8" Water Line.

Division A—Raw Water Pumping Station and Filter Plant

Division C—Electrical Contract Complete plans, specifications, and contract documents will be open for inspection at the A.G.C. offices in Raleigh, North Carolina, Greensboro, North Carolina, and Charlotte, North Carolina, and in the office of John A. Edwards, Consulting Engineer, Raleigh, North Carolina, or may be obtained from the Engineer upon a deposit of fifty dollars (\$50.00) per set for Division A and C, and twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per set for Division B. Full deposit will be returned to bona fide bidders and 50% of the deposit will be returned to all others returning the sets in good condition within seven (7) days after receipt of bids.

Consideration will be given only to bids of Contractors who submit evidence showing that they are licensed under "An Act to Regulate the Practice of General Contracting" ratified by the General Assembly of North Carolina on March 10, 1925, and so subsequently amended.

Proposals must be sealed and marked "Bid for Water Works Improvements." All proposals must be submitted upon the blank forms provided in the copies of the proposal, contract, and specifications. Bids must be accompanied by a certified check of five per cent (5%) of the amount of the bid, made payable to the Town of Zebulon, North Carolina, said check to be drawn on a bank or trust company insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, or a bidder's bond in the amount of five per cent (5%) of the amount of the bid.

A performance bond will be required for one hundred per cent (100%) of the Contract price.

No bids may be withdrawn after the scheduled time of receipt of bids for a period of sixty (60) days.
