Witness Convention

C. D. Raper, presiding minister of the Zebulon Rural Congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses, announced today that Witnesses from Zebulon will be meeting in Reidsville, April 19-21, for a three day training program. The assembly will attract delegates from the 18 congregations comprising North Carolina Circuit No. 2.

Commenting on the purpose of circuit assemblies, Raper said the Witnesses (about 989,000) are grouped into 22,166 congregations where they receive 5 hours of classroom study weekly. These congregations are organized into 1,725 circuits with a circuit assembly arranged semi-annually and "the assembly program, prototyping the classroom training at the congregation, is aimed at preparing effective home missionaries."

Raper remarked that the growth of the Witnesses has been so rapid the attendance is expected to exceed the number present at the 1960 Reidsville assembly even though there are five fewer congregations in the circuit.

The assembly sessions will begin Friday evening at 7:00 with the discourse "Right Kind of Ministers" by H. A. Cantwell. District Supervisor for the Watchtower Society, Cantwell is feature speaker for the convention and will deliver the keynote address, "Who Will Win the Struggle for World Supremacy", Sunday at 3 p.m.

All meetings of the local Witnesses will be canceled over the assembly weekend.

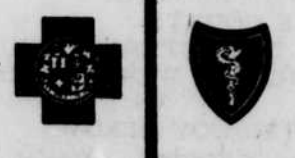
