Local Postmaster Implement New **Program for Dealing with Unions**

M. Dawson reported today.

The move-developed by the Postal Service under President employee organizations the right to Kennedy's historic Executive Order 10988 of Jan. 17, 1962-officially recognizes federal employee organizations for the first time. Recognition is based on results of the largest nation-wide labor management election, held June 15-July 1, 1962, in which 451,000 postal employees participated. Official results were issued to each post office by the Post Office Department in Washington.


