The J. L. Andersons of Eagle Rock spent last week in Virginia with their daughter and family, the Albert Stanleys. Mrs. Anderson is a shutin.

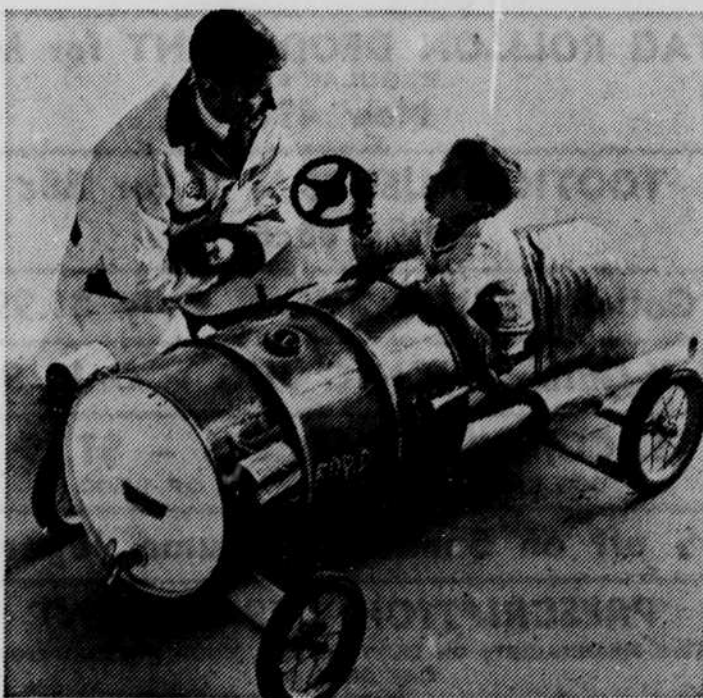
