The home and lawn were festive with decorations, and the honoree and guests were provided games prior to taking refreshments.

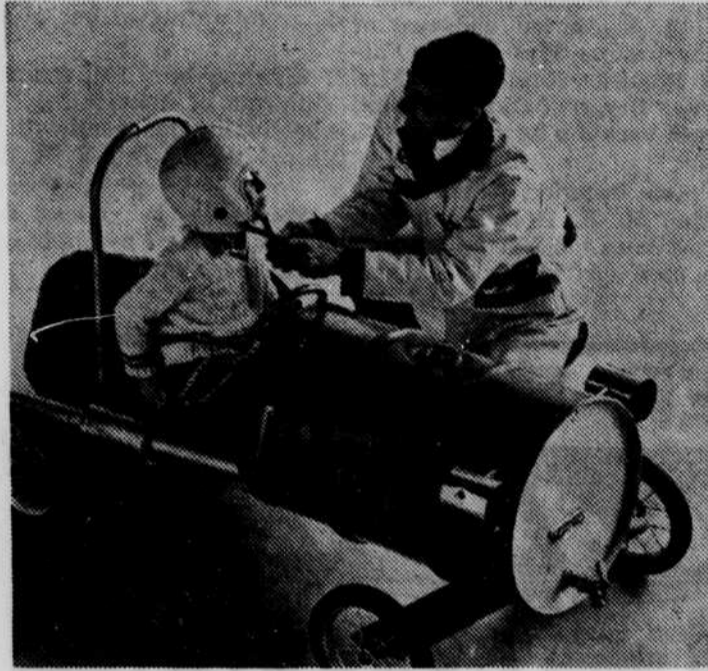

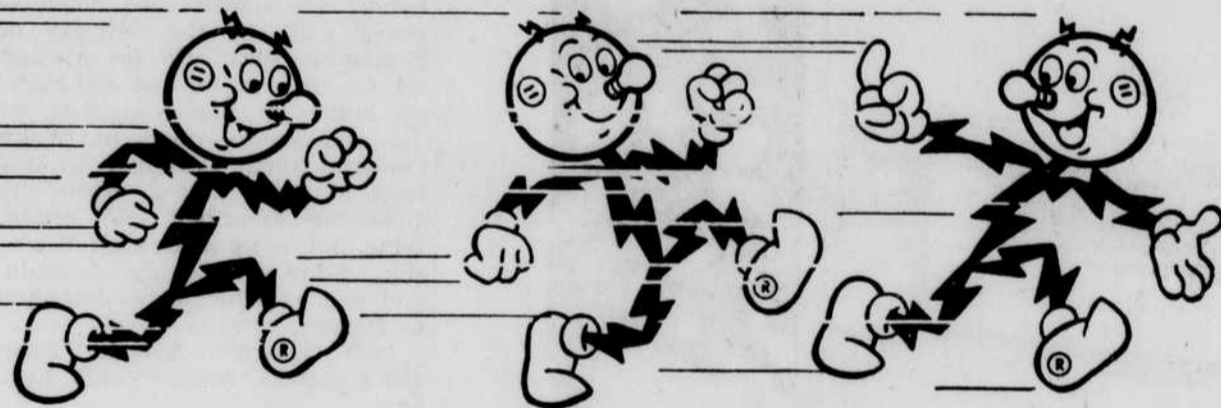
