Southern Bell has announced plans for an addition to the present building at 121 West Morgan St., Raleigh, according to R. U. Beck, manager.

R. N. Rouse and Company of Goldsboro will begin construction in a few days on the single-story, 16,000 square foot building.

This building will connect with the rear of the present building and will be constructed to support six floors for future expansion and will be completed in April, 1964.

The installation of equipment necessary for customer direct distance dialing will begin immediately upon completion of the building, and will be ready for use in September, 1964.

The building and equipment will cost over \$1,000,000 and will permit telephone users in the Raleigh, Apex, Cary, Garner, Knightdale, Wendell, Zebulon and Wake Forest areas to dial their own station-to-station calls direct to over 60,000,000 telephones in the United States and Canada.
