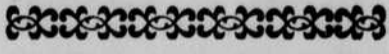

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Notice is hereby given under the provisions of Article 36, Part 2, of Chapter 160 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, that a public hearing will be held by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Zebulon at 7:30 p.m., Monday, November 4, 1963, in the municipal building of said Town of Zebulon on East Vance Street in said municipality, said hearing (in compliance with N.C.G.S. 160-453.5) to be held as a preliminary step in the annexation of real property to the said municipality. At said hearing a representative of the Town of Zebulon will make an explanation of the report required by N.C.G.S. 160-453.5, which report will be on file in the office of the Clerk of the Town of Zebulon from and

after October 8, 1963, having been prepared by the Zebulon Planning Board and approved by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Zebulon (as required by N.C.G.S. 160-453.5 (c); and interested parties may inspect the said report prior to the said hearing during regular office hours of the Town Clerk). A summary of the full report will be prepared for public distribution prior to the public hearing. Said summaries and the full report will be available at least 14 days prior to the public hearing.

The boundaries of the area under consideration for annexation are as follows:

Beginning at an old iron stake in the present boundary of the Town of Zebulon at the southwest corner of the intersection of Stronach Street and Whitley Street, and runs thence with the present boundary of the Town of Zebulon North 23 degrees 40 minutes West 180.0 feet and North 78 degrees 00 minutes West 503.9 feet; runs thence North 06 degrees 36 minutes East 297.6 feet to an iron stake; runs thence South 79 degrees 40 minutes East 209.0 feet to an iron stake; runs thence North 05 degrees 19 minutes East 245.0 feet to a stake on a branch; runs thence with said branch and the lines of Avon Privette and Elmer D. Finch (along a transverse of: North 22 degrees 49 minutes East 59.4 feet, North 51 degrees 32 minutes East 160.3 feet, North 65 degrees 24 minutes East 53.8 feet; North 89 degrees 32 minutes East 109.3 feet, North 53 degrees 00 minutes East 191.9 feet, North 44 degrees 06 minutes East 69.1 feet, North 51 degrees 11 minutes East 256.3 feet, North 85 degrees 06 minutes East 113.4 feet, South

53 degrees 05 minutes East 144.5 feet, and South 26 degrees 27 minutes East 291.0 feet) to the center of a culvert over Whitley Street Extension (Brantley Road); runs thence 30 feet in a southeasterly direction with said branch to the right-of-way line of Whitley Street Extension (Brantley Road); runs thence with the right-of-way of said road (center line calls of said road: South 36 degrees 04 minutes West 769.1 feet, South 39 degrees 39 minutes West 226.4 feet, and South 41 degrees 35 minutes West 157.8 feet) to the present town boundary of the Town of Zebulon; runs thence South 68 degrees 39 minutes West to a point in the center of the said road; runs thence South 68 degrees 39 minutes West 64.4 feet to the point of beginning, containing 19.3 acres, more or less, as shown by survey and map of A. W. Boyette, Registered Surveyor, dated August 27, 1963.

All said hearing all persons living or owning property in the above area and all residents of the municipality shall be given an opportunity to be heard.
