## Mrs. Liles Hostess

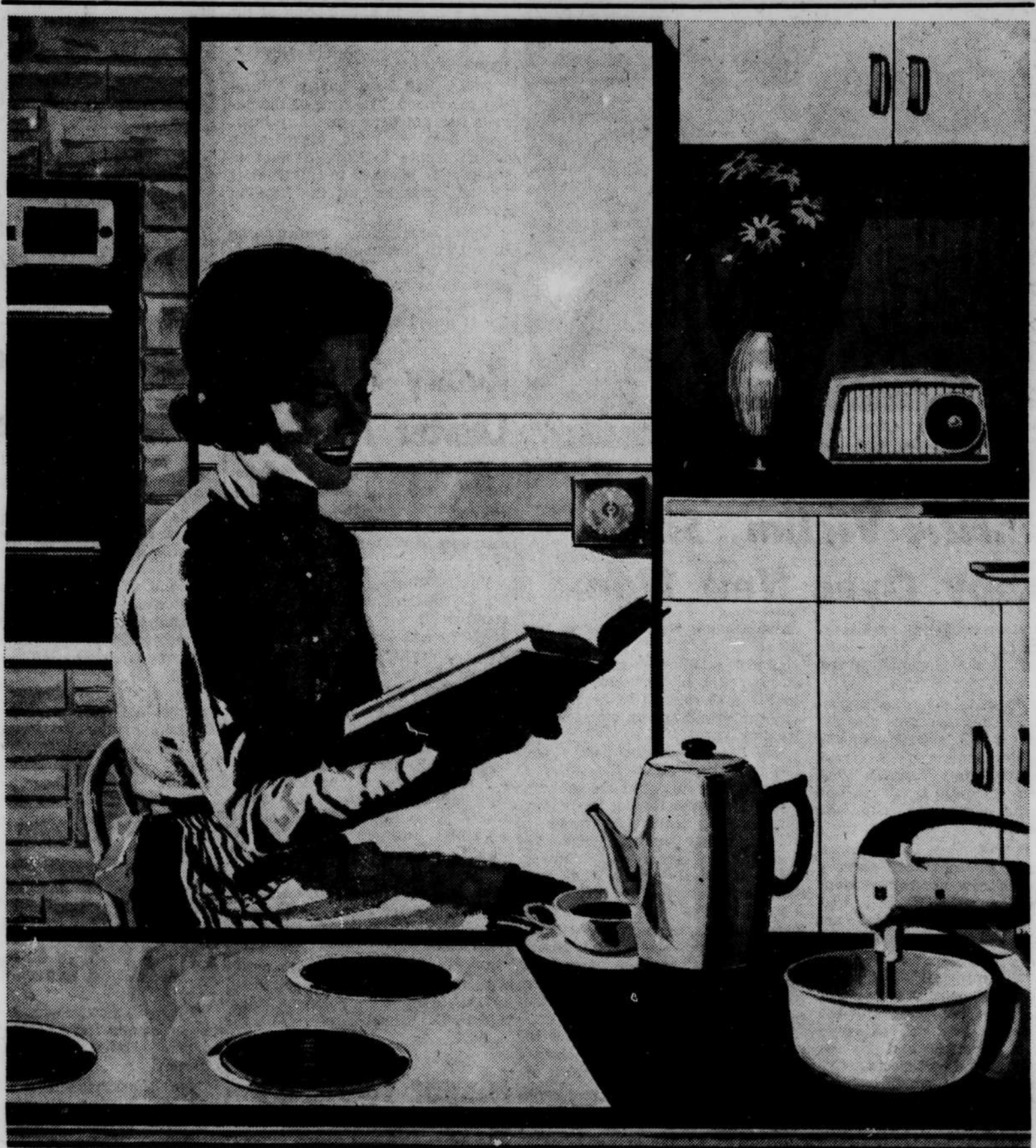
Members of the Bid-M Bridge Club were feted last week by Mrs. Jack Liles. Fall flowers in exquisite arrangements were used for decoration.
