Telephone Directory Being Distributed Throughout Area

Southern Bell's new Zebulon telephone directory is now being distributed.

Delivery began December 14, 1963, R. U. Beck, Southern Bell manager, said today.

About 1650 directories are being mailed in this area. This is 50 more than was distributed last year.

Frank S. Cooper, 46, husband of the former Ruby Temple of Zebulon, died Wednesday, Dec. 11, in Greensboro. Funeral rites were held Friday.

He was manager of a chain of shoe stores in eastern North Carolina and Virginia from 1935 until 1941. At the time of his death he was factory representative for the Freeman Shoe Co.

He was a veteran of World War II, a member of the Carolina MAC's and a member of St. John's Methodist Church.

Besides his wife, he is survived by a daughter, Jenny Cooper, who attends Mars Hill College; his mother, Mrs. Lettie Cooper Perry of Pittsboro, and one brother, W. R. Cooper of Monroe.

Funeral services were held at the Hanes-Lineberry Funeral Chapel in Greensboro. The Rev. Claude B. Bower, pastor of the First Baptist Church, and the Rev. L. F. Strader, pastor of St. John's Methodist Church, officiated. Interment was in Green Hill Cemetery.

The Wakelon District School Committee voted at its last meeting to give a report of each meeting for publication to *The Zebulon Record*.

The paper heretofore has received very little information from the local school boards, and has been asked numerous times why publication of action taken by the boards was not made public.

At the December 9 meeting Wakelon Principal discussed before the committee the problem encountered in raising money to pay the band instructor, Jimmy Burns, for the current year. The problem was made more apparent when the Wake County School Board took action on limiting band tuition to \$3 per student per month.

The committee agreed that the most critical financial need of the school for the current term is the band program, and that any contributions for this purpose, without soliciting in competition with the Band Boosters Club, will be appreciated.

The school committee meets the second Monday night of each month.

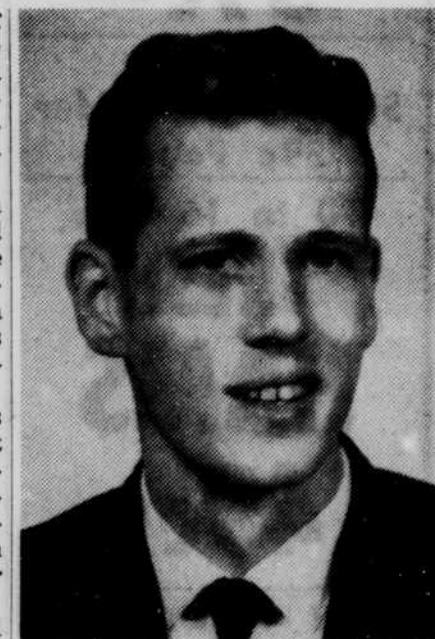
Local Man Is Area Agent For Southland Insurance Co.
