That the North doesn't agree with Craven county negroes is evidenced by the fact that during the past few weeks a number of colored men and women who early in the summer were induced to go to New York, Baltimore and Philadelphia to make their fortunes, have returned to their native home with a tale of woe as long as from here to yonder.

As was explained to these colored men and women before they departed for pastures new, they were being faked into the belief that all they had to do in the North was to loaf around and pick up dollar bills every few minutes.

It turned out that they were not only expected to work harder and longer, but, even though they were paid a little more than they received here, it cost them about twice as much to live and they were the losers all around.

It is safe to say that there will be no further influx of local negroes north of the Mason and Dixon line at any time in the near future.

## GEN. JAMES I. METTS HAS ISSUED AN ORDER

Veterans of The State to Meet in Convention at Raleigh Very Soon.

Major-General James I. Metts, commander of the Confederate Veterans of North Carolina, has issued the following general order:

"Par. 1. A convention of delegates from the camps composing the North Carolina Division of the U. C. V. will be held in the hall of the House of Representatives at Raleigh, N. C., at 8 o'clock p. m. on Wednesday, the 17th day of October, 1917, for the purpose of electing the Division and four Brigade Commanders, and transacting such other business as may be necessary.

"Par. 2. Only those camps will have a voice in this convention that have paid their annual dues. All camps in arrears are earnestly requested to pay their arrears without further delay.

"Par. 3. All Veterans in the State are cordially invited to attend this convention."

(By Associated Press.) NEW YORK, Sept. 26.—Cotton futures opened steady. October 24.35; December 23.55; January 23.60; March 23.65; May 23.75.

NEW YORK (Wall Street), Sept. 26.—Tightening of money rates caused by yesterday's unexpected advance in call loans to 7 per cent exerted an adverse influence at the outset of today's trading in the stock market. Leaders in the various active groups, including equipments, coppers, motors and leathers fell 1 to 2 points, on fairly large offerings. United States Steel reacted over a point, but rails and shipping yielded more moderately. Many lots of Liberty bonds changed hands at par.

### COTTON MARKET IRREGULAR.

(By Associated Press.) NEW YORK, Sept. 26.—The cotton market showed renewed irregularity early today. First prices were 28 points higher to 7 points lower with near months relatively firm on covering. With the trade nervous over the tropical storm outlook the market firmed up several points from the lowest on covering.

## INTERESTING TESTIMONY BY WIFE OF SLAIN MAN

Thos. Bailey Who Killed B. B. Barrett Had Threatened To Do So.

DANVILLE, aV., Sept. 26.—That Thomas Bailey, who shot and killed Berry B. Barrett yesterday morning, as late as Sunday told friends that he had warned Barrett that he would blow his brains out if he ever questioned his conduct with Barrett's wife was the startling testimony given yesterday evening at the coroner's inquest by Mrs. Barrett.

The young man, who was present and who asked to testify in order that it might not appear that he was trying to conceal anything, was suffering from a bad case of nerves and cried piteously as he reached the climax of his story. J. D. Jones, who was trying to settle the differences between Barrett and his wife and who saw the shooting, said that Barrett, after being called a liar by Bailey, closed with him, folding his arms about him. At that time Bailey had no revolver in his hand. They struggled from the parlor to the hall and Bailey, after managing to free one arm, ran his hand into his trousers pocket and drew forth the pistol and began to shoot. Bailey says that he does not even know if he pulled the trigger, for he was too intent on keeping the muzzle away from his direction.
