TRUCK RAILROAD FOR A LARGE SUM

Engineer Seeks Damage For Injuries Received During Wreck

H. R. Shackelford, an employe of the Norfolk Southern Railway company and whose home is at Washington, N. C., has instituted legal proceedings against that company for damages in the sum of \$100,000 for injuries which he received when the locomotive of which he was in charge crashed through the railway bridge over Neuse river some months ago.

Mr. Shackelford and his fiancée had a narrow escape from death during the accident and the former lost one eye as the result of the same. A local law firm has been engaged to handle the suit and the case bids fair to be a most interesting one.

HALIFAX COMMISSIONERS ACQUIRE A TOLL BRIDGE

WELDON, July 13.—At the meeting of the commissioners of Halifax county for July, they voted to purchase the direct bridge across the Roanoke river at Roanoke Rapids, the price paid being \$35,000.
