"What good will it do to build houses for them? Not a bit, unless they are provided with means to buy furniture and household goods. They cannot hope to do this of their own accord from the revenue which they will earn in a few months. We must also take the utmost precautions to guard against a possible epidemic growing out of our sanitation problem. It is a mammoth and gigantic task that confronts us; one in which we must welcome outside aid and accept it gratefully."

COTTON MEN IN CONVENTION

Intensive Campaign To Be Waged in Behalf Growers And Buyers of Cotton

MEMPHIS, Tenn., Dec. 4.—An intensive campaign against the boll weevil and other insect enemies of the cotton grower, uniform and improved marketing methods for cotton, warehousing plans and finally the formation of a governmental cotton commission composed of members from each producing state to secure uniform legislation for the solution of the problems of the cotton grower, buyers, warehouseman and others, was the subject of a conference of representatives from 12 cotton growing states, held here today.

R. O. Everett, of Durham, N. C., in which the movement for the organization of the commission was initiated, called the conference to order. A. W. McLean, of Lumberton, N. C., will close the day's session by outlining the plans proposed for making the commission a permanent governmental body, working in co-operation with the United States Department of Agriculture and the various state experimental stations in securing the enactment of uniform legislation in each state, which will aid the cotton grower not only to control insect pests but in marketing and warehousing his crops most advantageously.
