IMPORTANT NOTICE

TO THE BANK OR TRUST COMPANY ADDRESSED:—

The Secretary of the Treasury has given notice in Treasury Circular No. 299, dated July 26, 1922, that in order to facilitate the refunding of the Victory Liberty Loan and provide for the retirement of part of the outstanding notes before maturity, all 4 3/4 per cent Victory Notes which bear the distinguishing letters A, B, C, D, E or F prefixed to their serial numbers have been called for redemption on December 15, 1922, and may be surrendered for redemption before that date at the option of the holder, upon the terms and conditions and subject to the rules and regulations prescribed in Department Circular No. 299.

Payment for Victory Notes in registered form received by the Federal Reserve Bank of Richmond for redemption can not be made by the Federal Reserve Bank until after the registered Victory Notes have been forwarded to the Treasury Department for the discharge of registration. Immediately upon discharge of registration by the Treasury Department we are advised by telegram, and settlement is made for the Victory Notes on the same day the telegram is received by use from the Treasury Department advising that the registration has been discharged.

THEREFORE, IN ORDER TO EFFECT PAYMENT PROMPTLY ON DECEMBER 15, HOLDERS OF CALLED REGISTERED VICTORY NOTES, KNOWN TO YOUR BANK SHOULD BE ADVISED BY YOU TO ASSIGN THE NOTES AND FORWARD THEM TO THE FEDERAL RESERVE BANK AS PROMPTLY AS POSSIBLE FOR REDEMPTION.
