COL. BRYAN IS NOT IN RACE FOR PRESIDENCY
"I have refused in every manner, save saying under 'no condition,'" declared Col. William Jennings Bryan, at his home in Grove Park, Asheville, when asked if he would become a candidate for the presidency, says a dispatch from Asheville. "There is little probability," he continued, "of my becoming a candidate, as I will make no campaign. The only condition which would prevail upon me to run would be the belief that it was my duty, and it now is not in that light, nor do I expect it to be."
Asked if he knew who would be the candidate of the Democratic party this year, Col. Bryan said that he did not know; that no one knows; no one can know until very much nearer the time of the convention, or at the convention, he stated.

DAYLIGHT SAVING LAW IN EFFECT IN NEW YORK STATE
Operation of the New York State daylight saving law, which became effective at 2 a. m. Sunday through the refusal of the legislature to repeal the bill, is expected materially to affect the business hours and conditions in stock and trade conditions throughout the country. Some confusion is expected to result in New York by reason of the fact that the railroad time table will continue to be used on standard time. Banks, courts, churches, theaters, traction—in fact, virtually all activities in New York—will operate on "summer time."
