One matter which should not escape the attention of the law-makers is the fact that North Carolina needs, and that badly, a compulsory school law. Just at this time when the tax payers are called upon to give of their means for the support of our educational system and when they see from twenty to thirty-five per cent of the boys and girls of school age remaining at home or strolling idly about the streets and rural districts, it is only natural that the taxpayers should "kick," when paying their money to support schools when thoughtless children and seemingly careless parents do not avail themselves of the opportunities afforded. Compulsory attendance for at least four months during the year will solve the problem.

The voters of Nash county expressed themselves in no unmistakable terms on the "salary" or "fee" system. Now it is up to Chairman Vaughan and the Democratic administration to carry out their pledge to the people, who were given to understand that full inquiry into this important matter would be made. Now, what are you going to do about it?

The special committee selected by representative citizens from the various townships to frame a special road law for those townships now without means or mode for working the public roads, will meet in Nashville on the first Monday in February to submit the measure decided upon for adoption, revision or rejection. Should the bill meet the approval of the citizens here on the day above given it will be sent to the legislature for passage.

Some time ago The Graphic published an editorial commenting on the necessity of making some provision for the care of the wives and widows of Confederate veterans. We are glad to note that Representative McGill has introduced a bill in the legislature to make an appropriation of \$5,000 for the erection of a woman's building at the Soldier's Home and \$5,000 annually for its maintenance.
