PAPER DANGERS INCREASE

Federal Commission Asks Manufacturers to Do Best to Help Them.

The Federal trade commission has sent the following letter to each member of the News Print Manufacturers' association and also given it out to the press: "While the commission's print paper investigation is not yet completed, the information already collected shows that a large number of the smaller daily and weekly newspapers are paying from 4 to 8 cents a pound for their news print paper, in comparison with a price of from 2 to 3 cents at the beginning of the year.
