Nash county's quota of the Armenian-Syrian relief fund has not yet been subscribed. This amount was only \$7,000, and is too small an amount for our people to disregard, especially when the aggregate for the entire state means so much for the thousands of starving people in Armenia and the Near East. In calling attention to the sore needs of the people, Secretary of War Baker, in a cablegram, says, "The need of the peoples is so grievous and appealing that the Department desires to do everything in its power to cooperate in relieving the condition of these people to contribute as far as this may be possible." President Wilson is urging the people to contribute to this worthy cause, because he knows there is no other hope of saving the lives of the four millions of people who are starving. Among these sufferers are 400,000 helpless little children who have lost their parents either by starvation or the hands of the Turkish murderers. Nash county citizens, open up your hearts and purse-strings to these starving children. See your township committeeman and make a donation.

Just at this time the Government has thousands of army trucks, tractors, trucks for road building, etc., which are available to road districts at marvellously low prices. Would it not be advisable for the Road Commissioners of Nashville Road District to secure one or more of these trucks to use on the roads of this district for hauling and grading purposes rather than the use of mules? One of these trucks will haul more gravel a greater distance, do more grading and scraping than ten head of mules. Distance would be a negligible matter and the cost of construction would be greatly reduced and at the same time of more benefit to the roads, which are growing from bad to worse on account of the failure to apply gravel instead of the accumulated washings of nearby fields and water drains.

The average reader of a newspaper cannot appreciate the great strain it is upon the editor of a weekly newspaper to sit for hours at his desk and pour his sympathies into an article which carries with it the sad tidings of the death of some of its closest friends. Especially is this hard on the newspaper man who has that genuine sense of sympathy for the left loved ones and who himself deeply prized the friendship of these departed ones. It is indeed one of the most trying duties to befall the average newspaper man in editing a newspaper.
