Methodists May Establish Religious Resort at Black Mountain.

Charlotte Chronicle, 15th.
Mr. R. O. Alexander leaves tonight for Chattanooga, Tenn., where he has been called by wire to attend the committee meeting appointed by the general Conference of the Methodist church to select a summer resort place for the Methodist Episcopal Church, South.

Mr. Alexander will attend the meeting, which will be held tomorrow in the interest of Black Mountain, which is under consideration and which it is thought will be chosen as the summer rendezvous of the Methodists.

The committee has an option on a vast number of acres of land near Black Mountain, which if selected will be developed in the same manner as Montreat has been built up by the Presbyterians.

There are over 2,000,000 Methodists from Virginia to Texas, and the choice of a North Carolina site will mean untold benefit to this State.

Bishop Atkins will attend the committee meeting in the interest of Waynesville. Waynesville will also be represented and the fight will be between Black Mountain, Waynesville and Weaverville. North Carolina mountains have been decided upon and upon the three locations under advisement options have been secured and a decision lies between them.

General Julian S. Carr, of Durham, will join Mr. Alexander at Salisbury tonight and will attend the meeting at Chattanooga. He is understood to be greatly interested in having Black Mountain chosen and with Mr. Alexander's strenuous efforts for that locality it is felt that every effort will be made in that direction.

Fire in Charlotte.

Fire, which originated in the work-room, damaged the plant of the Southern auto company, of Charlotte, to the extent of several thousand dollars Thursday night. The stock of the firm, which is now in the hands of receivers, is estimated at about \$10,000, but it is impossible to state the extent of the damage of tonight's fire. This same firm was burned out about a year ago.

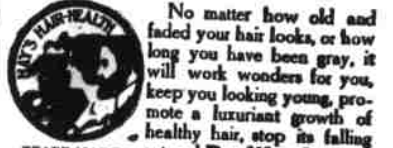
The entire stock was to have been sold out next week, advertisements for the sale having already been given to the local papers.
