WE MUST HAVE THE NEW RAILROAD.

There can be no doubt of the fact that Concord has the best chance right now to secure another trunk line railroad connection that it will ever have. At almost any time in the past the city would have eagerly jumped at such a proposition as is now presented to it, and it cannot afford not to do so now. It seems to be as certain as any human calculations can be certain that this road is going to be built and that it is going to be built right now. No better railroad proposition could be presented to Concord. This road would put the city in direct connection by trunk line with the north, east and west, and would give us every advantage in freight rates that Charlotte now enjoys. Besides it would give us better passenger accommodations, and there is nothing like competition to secure the best along this line.

The promoters of this railroad have made a plain simple proposition. They promise to bring the road by here if the people of the city will simply guarantee the cost of a right of way within the corporate limits and a site for the depot. There is no demand for nothing a large sum in bonds as is usually the case in matters of this kind. Can Concord afford to turn down such a favorable proposition as that?

Concord has been bottled up long enough and needs another railroad outlet. The city needs just now only such an impetus as this will produce to make it go forward by leaps and bounds.

OWD JERES THIEVES AS THEY GARRY BACK LOOT.

Concordville Soldiers Instead of Jail Term Forced Men to Run Gauntlet of Neighbors.  
Concordville, Nov. 13.—Amid the jeers of their neighbors, who turned out in force, three foreigners found guilty of stealing wood by Magistrate Lambert Clark Robinson, were forced to carry back in daylight the fruit of their nocturnal prowling.

A few days ago, the trio, living in the vicinity of the Valley Mills, near Concordville, were arrested on complaint of Superintendent Charles Scott, who charged them with having stolen oak timbers which had been stored at the mills. It was learned that the thieves had cut up the timbers and scattered the wood in several cellars, where it was discovered by the officers. Magistrate Robinson sentenced them to pay a fine and costs and directed them to take the wood back to the place from whence they stole it. They balked at that, and desired to pay a big price for the wood, but the owner insisted on getting back his timber.

The wood must be carried back in daylight," added the Justice, and when that was communicated to the prisoners one exclaimed: "We got to work in day time, have no time to carry back wood." "Will take all day to carry it back," remarked the second. "Sick at arm," said the third. But success did not go, and a constable was ordered to see that the sentence was carried out in daytime without delay.
