Of course no newspaper could stand such an expense as that without charging double price for subscription. All subscriptions to The Times

to whom the paper is delivered by mail that are nine months or more overdue will have to be discontinued. and also all to The Tribune that are as much as three months overdue However much we may desire to acnodate our subscribers we cannot do so, as the matter is not left optional with us.

We do not want to lose a single becriber we have. Many of them are our personal friends, and it would be hard to lose them. We trust all of them who happen to be in arrears will adjust the matter at the earliest possible moment so that we may not be forced to the unpleasant alternative of parting company with them.
