Dr. Paul Vaughn Leaves State.

(By the Associated Press.) Raleigh, N. C., June 21.—Acting on orders from the Federal Department of Agriculture, Dr. Paul Vaughn, who for some time has been in charge of the work of eradicating tuberculosis among cattle in the state, will leave here this afternoon for Columbus, Ohio, where he will assume charge of the co-operative field work of the Department in that state.

The authorities in charge of agricultural work here regret very much Dr. Vaughn's transfer as during his administration of office great progress is said to have been made in eradicating bovine tuberculosis. Twenty-five counties have appropriated funds for the work and the satisfactory progress which is said to have been made under Dr. Vaughn's leadership has attracted the notice of officials in other states and many of them have adopted the North Carolina plan of operation. One of Dr. Vaughn's duties in Ohio will be to inaugurate the North Carolina methods.

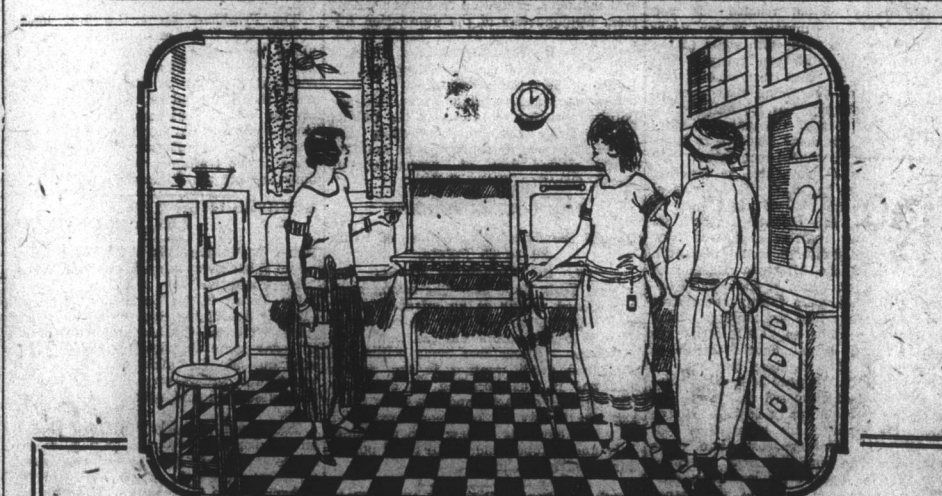
