Dallas, of Wilmington, sentenced in the New Hanover Superior Court following a bitterly contested trial to serve not less than two nor more than five years in the state prison for killing H. J. Southwell during the railroad shopmen's, strike of 1922, served notice today of withdrawal of his appeal to the North Carolina Su-preme Court, while was skeduled to be heard by the court this week. The first trial was pronounced a mis-trial, but at the second, Dallas, was convicted. He pleaded self defense.

Says Dispatch. (By the Associated Press.) London, Oct, 8.—Dr. von Kahr's so-called reactionary rule in Bavaria has led to counter measures in Thuringia and Saxony, whereby communists will enter the cabinet of those German states, says Reuter's Berlin correspondent. Conversations have been in progress between the Saxon and Thuringian pre-miers, with regard to the formation of an alliance with all the central states in Germany against the growth of fascism in Bavaria, and it is stated that these negoticions have led to the recognition of the need for the creation of a "red block."

Savage, according to Captain Leff, of the city detective bureau, confessed early to-day that he killed the woman.
