Mr. G. W. Lee, cotton census statistician for Cabarrus county, stated this morning that prior to October 18th this year 7,289 bales of cotton were ginned in this county compared with 6,340 bales to the same date last year.

The condition of Heffin Fincher, son of Rev. and Mrs. B. F. Fincher who was injured Friday when struck by a truck, is reported today as practically unchanged. The child was carried to the Concord Hospital immediately after the accident and there is every indication now that he will recover.

All of the six-months schools of the county except a few, opened for the 1923-24 term this morning. A number of the schools had already opened and a few postponed the opening until next Monday on account of local conditions. A number of school houses in the county have been greatly improved, and school officials are expecting a very successful year.

Nineteen cases were on docket for trial in recorder's court this morning. Eight of the defendants were charged with intoxication; three others were charged with having liquor; five were charged with violations of the traffic laws; two were charged with gambling and another with assault with a deadly weapon. Several of the cases were hard fought and court was in session for several hours.

Practically every teacher in the county was present Saturday for the first meeting of the white school teachers. The meeting was devoted strictly to a discussion of business and policies to be followed during the year being mapped out. The teachers went on record as favoring the project for school improvements in the county and endorsed the action of the school board in calling the special election of November 20th.

The big get-together meeting of members of the Y. M. C. A. will be held at the Y on Thursday night of this week, and officers of the association are making plans now to make the event one of the biggest in the history of the local association. Dr. Howard Rondthaler, President of Salem College, will be the speaker and members of the Salem Alumnae Association will serve supper to those present. The full program for the meeting will be announced later.

Carolina, State, Trinity and Wake Forest all were defeated Saturday in their football games. Carolina lost to Maryland 14 to 0; State was defeated by Y. M. I., 22 to 7; Virginia defeated Wake Forest. The Wake Forest team showed the best form, holding the strong Florida team to a close score. Notre Dame defeated Georgia Tech; Dartmouth won from Harvard; Yale defeated Brown and Princeton and the Navy played to a 3-3 tie.

Chicago, Oct. 28. Five teams, comprising the strongest field that has ever appeared here, wheeled away to-night at the coliseum in the start of the 5th international six-day bicycle race which will end at 11 o'clock next Saturday night after 146 hours of pedaling.

The beginning of the race marked the inauguration of "sleepless nights" for thousands of dyed-in-the-wool bike fans who sit, hour after hour, intently watching the whirling riders circle the track, always with the hope that "somebody will start something."

Maurice Brocco of Italy, and Willie Coburn of New Jersey, the team that stepped out and lapped the field twice the first hour in the last New York race, and maintained their advantage throughout the week, were popular favorites and were being counted on to try a similar feat soon after the start of tonight's grid.
