#### LOCAL MENTION

Marriage license was issued Tuesday by Register of Deeds Elliott to William E. Coble, of Greensboro, and Miss Ella Elizabeth Williams, of Concord.

The prayer-meeting at the Methodist Protestant Church will be held on Thursday evening instead of Wednesday this week, on account of the pastor, Rev. Lawrence Little, being out of the city.

Only routine business matters were presented at the stockholders of the Locke Cotton Mill at their annual meeting in the offices of the company here Tuesday. Old officers were re-elected and reports of officers of the company were submitted.

An address by Prof. J. B. Robertson will be one of the features of the meeting of the Howells Community Club tomorrow night. An interesting program has been arranged for the meeting, and a large audience is expected to take part in the program.

Six cases were on docket for trial in recorder's court this morning. In four cases defendants were charged with assaults with deadly weapons, in another the defendant was charged with assault and in the other the defendant was charged with intoxication. Three of the cases were against one man.

Cases of new diseases reported to the county health department Tuesday, according to a department report, include: one case of diphtheria, three cases of chicken pox, one case of measles, six cases of smallpox and nine cases of whooping cough. The smallpox patients live in Kannapolis, the report added.

The Men's Bible Class, Banquet of the First Presbyterian Sunday School will be held Thursday evening beginning at six-thirty o'clock. Members will note a change in the hour from seven to six-thirty, as this change was necessitated by not being able to secure the banquet hall of the Y. M. C. A. at the first-named hour.

The Concord high school basketball team will play its next game on Friday night of this week when it meets the Kannapolis high team here. The game will be played on the court of the local Y and will begin at 8 o'clock, the usual hour. The local team has played good ball this year and is confident of winning the game Friday.

R. D. Goodman, county farm agent, will give a culling demonstration on Friday afternoon of this week at 2 o'clock at the home of Mr. W. H. Bradford, in No. 5 township. Interest in culling demonstrations is increasing throughout the county, Mr. Goodman finds, and the public is invited to attend the demonstration at Mr. Bradford's.

Much public interest is being manifested in the sale of the Dusenbery property, which will take place tomorrow morning at 10:30 o'clock. The property is located on West Depot Street, just off Union Street and is recognized as very valuable property. The lot has been cut up into small lots and the entire tract will be sold at auction.

The funeral of James Franklin Teeter, father of Hampton Teeter, of this city, who died suddenly Tuesday in Salisbury at the home of relatives, was held this morning at 11 o'clock at Big Lick church in Stanly county. Mr. Teeter went to Salisbury Tuesday as soon as he heard of his father's death and accompanied other members of the family to Stanly county for the funeral.
