German Economist to Speak at Trinity College.

Trinity College, Feb. 7.—Trinity College will be the scene of a regular international parley on February 13th when the student body of that institution is addressed by Dr. von Schule Gaevernitz, a distinguished German economist, will speak on "the Peace of Versailles and the reparation problem."

Dr. von Schule Gaevernitz will come to this country and deliver a series of lectures under the auspices of the American Association for International Conciliation of New York City. The well known German has for the past twenty-five years been head of the department of economics at the University of Freiburg in Baden and was for twelve years a member of the Reichstag, representing the South German Democrats who were opposed to the militarism of Bismarck. Besides his university training he has been a student in England and Russia and has written a number of widely known works on economics.
