TOWNSHIP SUNDAY SCHOOL INSTITUTE. To Be Held in the First Presbyterian Church March 5-7. D. W. Sims, who for the past three years has been General Superintendent of the North Carolina Sunday School Association, will take an important part on the program of the Concord Township Sunday School Institute which convenes in the First Presbyterian Church, Concord, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, March 5, 6 and 7. The initial session will be held Wednesday night, March 5th, beginning at 7:30 o'clock.

For a number of years Mr. Sims has been prominently connected with Sunday School work in different parts of the country and is widely and favorably known for the excellent type of work he is doing. Mr. Sims is said to be one of the most attractive and helpful speakers in the Sunday School field, his addresses being shot through with wit and humor, and yet full of practical suggestions for Sunday School workers. Having helped in several previous Sunday School meetings held in Concord, Mr. Sims will probably be remembered by a large number of the Sunday School leaders.

Sharing the work of the Institute with Mr. Sims will be Mr. Walter E. Myers, General Secretary Pennsylvania Sunday School Association, Philadelphia, Pa., and Miss Flora Davis, Assistant Superintendent North Carolina Sunday School Association, Raleigh. Mr. Myers will give a special series of addresses dealing with principles and methods of work with adults in the Sunday School and with Sunday School administration. He has had broad training and experience in these particular lines of work. Among other things, Miss Davis will give several addresses on the theme of "Stories and Story Telling for the Sunday School."

Workers from all Sunday Schools in the township have been invited to attend the Institute. The officers of the county and Township Associations are expecting a good attendance at all sessions.
