### BUSINESS OUTLOOK BETTER.

More favorable business conditions are beginning to reveal themselves and light stocks are making the buying outlook bright, according to The Dry Goods Economist, which, in its weekly review, points out that last week opened with more favorable conditions. Cotton advanced to 28.00 cents for spots in New York, wheat recovered and corn also rose, and that the month-end report of the Federal Reserve Bank in Minneapolis, which applies to an extensive farming region wherein there has been much complaint of hard times, reports abnormally large marketing of agricultural products in February, with extraordinary increases in the grains, especially corn. Uncertainty as to cotton prices continues to dominate both sellers and buyers, but there is a feeling among the former that an upward reaction in the cotton market cannot be long deferred, continues the trade paper quoted. They point to the small amount of cotton left on hand and also to the exports, which for the eight months ending February 29 were nearly 410,000 bales greater than for the same period a year ago. Imports of raw cotton for the eight months were about one-half of the quantity imported during the same period a 12-month earlier.

The reduction of two cents a yard in the price of percales cannot be taken as any clear indication of the course of cotton goods prices, the more so as it follows a reduction of three cents a yard made some time ago. For a considerable period there has been little interest in percales on the part of consumers. The new price, moreover, has failed to stimulate business on this kind of goods.

Significant future demand for goods is the report of the National Wholesale Dry Goods Association estimating the wholesalers' commitments at from 33 1/3 to 60 per cent. of what they were on March 15, 1923. That retail sales throughout the country are keeping up well is indicated by the report for the 10 stores operated by the National Department Stores for the fiscal year ended January 31, last, showing a total sales volume of \$72,231,456, against \$64,715,521 for the preceding year. As these stores are operated in Cleveland, Pittsburgh, St. Louis, Wheeling, Philadelphia and Detroit, the report gives a fair indication of retailing conditions over a wide stretch of country.

Raw wool at auction in foreign markets continues to sell at high prices, with an advancing tendency in fine grades, for which there is an active demand. The last of the Fall openings by large American manufacturing corporations was scheduled for near the close of this week.

In the silk fabrics field there is more activity on wash silks, due to the retailers' demand for such goods for special sales. High-class printed silks continue to sell in a reasonable way.

In emulating the varsity baseball team in taking a "spring training trip," Harvard oarsmen are setting what is believed to be a precedent in collegiate rowing.

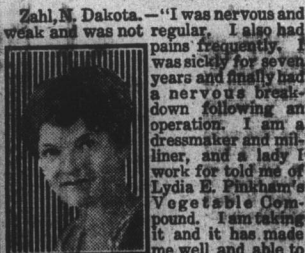

### Mad Dog Ordinance

Owing to the large number of mad dogs running at large and to protect the school children and citizens from rabies, and to save the people from spending large sums of money and suffering the pain of taking the Pasteur treatment, be it therefore resolved by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Concord:

Section 1. That from the publication of this Ordinance and until November 1st, 1924, it shall be unlawful for any dog to run at large within the corporate limits of the City of Concord, or within one mile of said City limits, unless such dog shall wear a tag issued under authority of law showing that such dog has been vaccinated for rabies.

Sec. 2. Any owner or any person having under his control any dog, which shall permit such dog to run at large in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined Twenty-Five Dollars or imprisoned fifteen days, and any dog so found running at large not wearing the necessary tag showing that it has been properly vaccinated, will be killed by any policeman of the City.

This April 3, 1924.  
Dr. T. N. Spence or any other veterinary surgeon or medical doctor can administer the rabies vaccine, and when your dog is vaccinated the doctor will furnish the owner with a card properly filled out and signed and will also furnish the tag to be placed on the collar of the dog.
