Not Only Will Not Appear in Person But Hereafter Will Not Be Represented by Counsel.

STATEMENT READ TO COMMITTEE

(By the Associated Press.) Washington, June 4.—Former Attorney General Daugherty today notified the Senate committee which has had his official conduct under investigation for nearly four months that he would neither testify as a witness, nor be represented further by counsel in its proceedings.

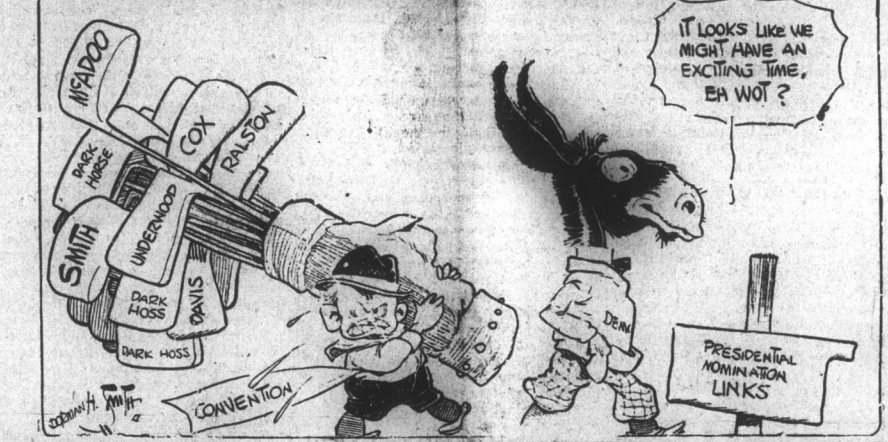
Dr. Grayson Draws an Intimate Picture of the Late Woodrow Wilson
