

H. P. FARIS HEADS PROHIBITION TICKET

Miss Marie C. Brehm, of California, is Nominated to Make Race For Vice-President.

Columbus, June 6.—H. P. Faris, Mo., was nominated for the presidency today by the prohibition national convention, on the first ballot. He received 82 votes, 40 being cast for A. P. Gouthey, of Seattle, and two for William F. Varney, New York.

A. P. Gouthey, of Seattle, Wash., was nominated for vice president on the first ballot. The vote was Gouthey 78 1-2; Miss Marie C. Brehm, California 22 1-2; A. L. Moody, Indiana 7.

Dr. Gouthey threw the convention into confusion by withdrawing after his nomination had been announced. Dr. D. L. Colvin, of New York, moved a reconsideration of the ballot and a new ballot was ordered and Miss Marie C. Brehm, of California, was nominated by acclamation.

Will Not Present Name of Johnson

Cleveland, June 6.—It was definitely made known yesterday for the first time, with official sanction, that the name of Hiram Johnson will not be presented to the convention and that no votes are expected to be cast for him from the floor, as will be done for Senator LaFollette. State Senator George H. Bender, Johnson's manager in Ohio, announced that there will be no nomination of the Californian and that he stood by his previous release of his delegates. William M. Butler, president Coolidge's manager said he had been advised that the two Johnson delegates chosen in Illinois would cast their votes for Coolidge.

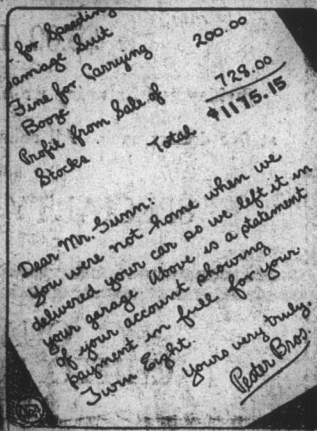

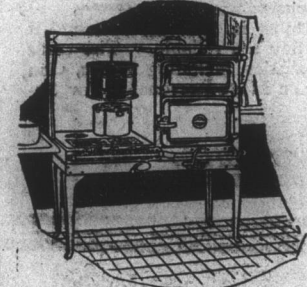
