In June Last Year 542,020 Bales Were Consumed.— Cotton on Hand in South Is 1,246,136 Bales.

(By the Associated Press.) Washington, July 14.—Cotton con-sumed during June amounted to 350.277 bales of lint, and 39,583 of linters, com-pared with 413,649 of lint and 42,481 of linters in May this year, and 542,-026 of lint and 48,944 of linters in June last year, the census bureau announced today. Cotton on hand June 30th was held as follows: In consuming establish-

as follows: In consuming establish-ments 950,625 bales of lint and 110,778 of linters: and in public storage and at compresses, 82,204 of lint and 69,742 of linters.

230,979 bales, including 13,381 bales of Inters. Cotton spindles active during June totalled 29,216,486 of which 15,582,725 were in cotton growing states.
