That housewife that does not wish to resort to the chopping block can buy her turkey already sacrificed and dressed, ex-cept for the standfing and gravy, for be-tween 60 and 70 cents per pound. The cranberry still runs free of mon-opoly and as a result it is cheaper than last year, grocers report. A year ago cranberries sold for 25 cents a quart and this year they can be purchased for 20 cents. Mince meat which is essen-tial to the success of any Thanksgiving dinner to many persons, is selling for the same as last year.

dinner to many persons, is selling for the same as last year. Yegetables will sell at practically the same prices which prevailed last year. Take your choice. Green peas, black-eyed peas, Mexican jumping beans, Bos-ton baken beans, Trish potatoes, white hotatoes, sweet potatoes, candid yams with plenty of juice, sugar and gravy, cabbage, cauliflour and sweet pickles will all be in the reach of the person who was able to buy them a year ago. Fruits are a little higher than a year ago but nuts are cheaper, most groeers report. Raisins, except those from Cal-ifornia, are cheaper. Grapes are higher and there will be practically no Malga grapes obtainable in the whole country on account of an einbargo against their importation.

importation. Apples raised in the east will cost about the same but the prices of Cali-fornia and Oregon apples will be higher on 'account of short crops. Nuts with the exception of pecans, will be cheaper. The pecans will sell for about the same price as last year. Eggs are a fittle higher than they were a year ago, but many of the other in-


