Misses Lucy and Eleanor Crowell have returned to N. C. State College for Women at Greensboro, after spending the holidays here with their parents, Mr. and Mrs. J. L. Crowell.

A special movie program is to be presented at the Y tonight in which some of the best comedies given in years, it is said, will be presented. The public is cordially invited to attend.

Football finals for the year were played New Year's day in California when the inter-sectional games were played. Notre Dame finished the season with a clean slate by defeating Stanford 27 to 10 and California is finished the season with a 14 to 0 victory over Pennsylvania.

Mrs. Harry Hopkins and children left Friday night for Baltimore, where they will make their home in the future. Mr. Hopkins has been working in Baltimore for several weeks and his family has been with Mr. and Mrs. J. F. Goodson, parents of Mrs. Hopkins.

It is reported here that D. F. Widenhouse, federal prohibition agent, took part in many raids during November and December and during the two months he is said to have seized and destroyed 31 stills, 11,550 gallons of beer and 290 gallons of liquor and brandy.

Progress is being made on the new apartment house being erected by J. P. Cook on his property at the intersection of Spring and Corbin streets. Work on the structure was begun several weeks ago and while the work has been interrupted several times by bad weather, some progress has been made.

The many friends of Key Scales, general manager of the W. B. Ward, wholesale grocery company, were glad to see him back in his office Friday evening on Church Street for a few hours, after having been confined at his home in Albemarle for three weeks with a severe case of influenza.

The regular January meeting of the county commissioners will be held at the court house here Monday morning. It is known that several matters of general interest to the county, in addition to routine questions, will be presented to the board members at the meeting. All members of the board are expected to be present at the meeting.

John M. Oglesby, who served with the Marines during the World War, has received his insurance certificate from the government. The certificate is one of the first, if not the first, to reach Concord, as Mr. Oglesby filed his application early last year. The insurance certificate is sent instead of cash to men who are entitled to more than \$50.

J. H. Brown, county welfare officer, Friday night arrested here a girl who is alleged to have escaped from Samarand. The girl had been at the institution for more than two years. Two other girls who escaped with her, came to Concord but later left, the girl is said to have told Mr. Brown after she was lodged in the county jail. She will be carried back to Samarand.

Much interest has been manifested here in the proposition that the city purchase an incinerator in which trash and rubbish would be burned. At their meeting Thursday night aldermen of the city discussed the matter and appointed a committee to investigate the matter fully.

It is probable that the committee will visit nearby cities to see incinerators in action and to learn whether they are satisfactory.

A number of defendants were tried in recorder's court Friday afternoon. Two paid fines of \$25 and others were sentenced to the chain gang and jail. One man was given four months for larceny and another was given sixty days in jail for having liquor for sale. This same defendant was given ninety days on the chain gang for receiving, capias not to issue upon serving of sixty-day sentence and good behavior.

Post and Flag's Cotton Letter.

New York, Jan. 2.—Pressure has been steady and rather heavy attributed generally to liquidation through wire and commission houses which with local short selling for a time forced a decline that caught a fair quantity of crops in its course. There appears to be no special reason for such action but it was becoming obvious that trade conditions have not yet improved sufficiently to bring in enough support from that source to hold prices above twenty-five cents. Many who bought at lower levels accepted profits last week but others carried their cotton over for income tax purposes and it is believed liquidation of that sort which the market has been called upon to absorb today. The disposition to sell was promoted by figures issued from a private source indicating a carryover of all growths at the end of July so large as to render any scarcity this season highly improbable if the figures are borne out by later facts. The inference is that a further advance must be chiefly contingent on the influence of the next crop which will hardly make itself felt for a good many weeks to come and about which no one can be sure whether it will be bearish of bullish. It remains that leading representatives of the trade both here and abroad express confidence that requirements for American will be practiced by thirteen million which after all is the point of chief interest to the American markets and that prices for other growths have advanced with even greater rapidity than those for the native growth. Holders appear to be standing firmly and determined to fight for at least 25 cents for their cotton. Plenty of irregularity must be expected but the constructive side of easy markets like this looks the best for a pull.

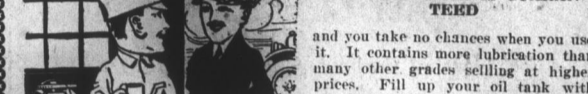

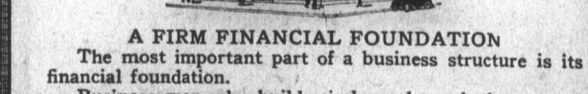
