The work which is being done consists of digging small holes in the side walks about two inches in diameter and eight inches in depth, following which small iron pipes are to be inserted with a cap flush with the street. Flag poles twelve feet in heighth are furnished to place in these holes.

At the top of the flag pole, an American flag is fixed, it being 12 by 6 feet. The flag clears the sidewalk seven feet, making, it possible for pedestrians to rassily walk under it.
