MRS. SALLIE B. FERGUSON DIED HERE THIS MORNING

Had Been Ill For Week With Pneumonia and Her Death Was Not Unexpected. —Funeral Tomorrow Afternoon.

Mrs. Sallie B. Ferguson, one of Concord's oldest and best known women, died this morning at 8:15 o'clock at her home on Georgia Avenue after an illness of a week with pneumonia. For several days she had been critically ill and her death did not come as a surprise to relatives and friends who had kept advised as to her condition from day to day.

Funeral services will be held tomorrow afternoon at 2:30 o'clock at her late home on Georgia Avenue, and interment will be made in Oakwood cemetery. Services at the home and cemetery will be conducted by Rev. G. A. Martin, of Landrum, S. C., former pastor of the First Baptist Church of this city.

Mrs. Ferguson was a daughter of the late Joel Hill and was born and reared in the Rocky River neighborhood. She was born October 9, 1836, and spent her entire life in Cabarrus county.

Mrs. Ferguson was twice married, her first husband being Joseph Hill. To this union two children were born, W. J. and Edwin Hill, both of whom are dead. Several years after Mr. Hill's death the deceased was married to W. M. Ferguson, who died August 2, 1891. To this union three children were born, and two of them, Mrs. Harry Trice, of this city, and Miss Annie Ferguson, of Statesville, survive.

Mrs. Ferguson was a member of the First Baptist Church and for years was one of the church's most active members. She was widely known throughout the city and county, her family having been prominent in the life of the county for many years.

NO MORE KICKS FOR THE ICEMAN

New Machine Installed by A. B. Pounds Eliminates Guess-Work in Cutting Ice.

As civilization advances, one by one the joys are being taken out of life. The latest joy-killer comes as a distinct blow to the housekeepers. No longer will they be able to stand on their back porches and berate the poor ice man for giving them short weight. An invention has robbed them of this.

The new invention which is now being installed by A. B. Pounds scores the ice before it leaves the factory so that there can be no mistake in the number of pounds of the piece. Therefore the iceman took a shot at the number of pounds he was cutting off and let the customer suffer if it were too little or let the manufacturer suffer if it were too much.

Now, however, the piece is marked so that it eliminates all guess work, all hazardous sawing and all chipping to get it to fit. Each block is so scored that it only takes a jab or two of a pick to make it break into a square block of the desired weight.

Although they hate to see the cause of quarreling with the iceman go, housekeepers are glad that the new invention is being installed by Mr. Pounds since now they will know how much ice they have on hand and exactly how much will be required from day to day.

To Show Health Educational Films in County.

Dr. S. E. Buchanan, county health officer, has made arrangements with the State Board of Health to show a number of health educational films in Cabarrus county this week.

The pictures will be shown for the first time tonight at the Roberta Mill school at 7:30. Tomorrow night, at the same hour they will be shown at the Wincoff school and on Wednesday night at the same time they will be shown at the Kannapolis Y. M. C. A.

The pictures will be shown on a machine carried with him by a representative of the State Board of Health who has been with the films. The pictures have been shown in various counties of the State and have created much interest.

No admission charge will be made at the various places in the county where the films will be shown.

The pictures are being taken first to those centers which have electric current as the generator which usually furnishes electric power for the movie machine was broken last week. If it is repaired in time the picture will be carried to all parts of Cabarrus county.

Dr. Buchanan has made arrangements to show the picture for thirty minutes at the meeting of the Concord Rotary Club Wednesday.

Officials Prevent Duel in Louisiana.

LaFayette, La., March 1.—Edwin Guilbeau, 62, and his 25-year-old nephew, Adam Guilbeau, arrested under charges of violating the state anti-duelity law, today were under \$500 bail at their farm homes near Carencro.

The men were arrested under the charge that the uncle had challenged his nephew and the latter accepted. At the sheriff's office it was said they were preparing to use shotguns of 25 caliber. Ill feeling had existed between the two for some time, officers said.
