SUNDAY SCHOOL LEADERS TO TAKE STUDY COURSE

Methodists and Presbyterians Combine in Conducting a Co-operative Training School.

Beginning Sunday, March 22nd, the Methodist and Presbyterian denominations of Cabarrus county will hold what is to be known as the Cabarrus County Co-operative Standard Training School for Sunday School Leaders at Central Methodist Church. It is to continue to March 27th.

The Cabarrus County Co-operative Standard Training School is to be a real school. It must meet the conditions outlined by the Sunday School authorities of the Methodist and Presbyterian denominations. Each student should secure the text book designated for his class, and, if possible, read it through before the opening of the school. Books can be obtained from Rev. W. A. Jenkins at his office. Enroll with the chosen class and stay with it throughout the school. The visit from class to class will do very little good. It will break down the morale of the school.

Any person over seventeen years of age, who otherwise complies with conditions, may receive certificate of credit. High school graduates sixteen years of age may receive credit. No certificate of credit can be issued to one under sixteen years of age. Students in this school can earn one of the necessary twelve units for a Sunday school diploma, eight of which must be general studies and the other four specializations units in any one given department.

Those enrolling in the school are expected to attend all twelve recitations unless unavoidably kept away. No credit can be assigned to one who has not attended at least ten of the twelve class sessions. There is no charge attached to the school save that of the price of text books. Every one, whether student, auditor or visitor, is welcome. Bring a pencil and note book.

MRS. ROGERS ON TOUR ENTERTAINED AT HAITI

Secretary Beulah June Night With the "Fireflies Tangled in a Silver Braid."

A letter has been received in the city from Mrs. Frank Rogers, who is touring the West Indian Islands with a party of tourists from Houston, Texas, and other southern cities, in which she tells of the delightful time she is having on the month's cruise. The letter was written on board the ship "The Lafayette."

Mrs. Rogers says: "Most of the ports we enter are too shallow for our boat so we are met with tugs and are taken in."

"Each day is filled with surprises for us. Port au Prince is the capital of the Haitian government. The Maring troops gave us an auto ride to all points of interest. There are many winding dirt streets in this negro republic. Some of the natives wear clothes and some go altogether without them."

"The clubs of the city were thrown open to the party and lunch was served in the home of an army officer and his wife, giving us a view of a home setting to which we were unaccustomed. An informal reception by President and Madam Barno at the palace was delightful. Both are just as black as they could be but both were intellectual looking and charming in manner. The reception was followed by a review of the army."

"We returned to the wharf and boarded our launches carrying impressions of Haiti as an island sparkling with thousands of lights scintillating from the glowing fires of charcoal burners over the mountains. It recalled a home scene on a June night with fireflies tangled in silver braid."

"The waters around Haiti are clear but nothing in comparison to those of Nassau, the most brilliant I've ever seen in coloring. The emerald green of the water and the blue of the skies is combined with a marvellous white sand beach. We anchor in the harbor of Porto Rico in the morning. A ninety-three mile ride over the island; a reception at the governor's mansion are planned for us. And of course there is some shopping, a temptation always held out to us."

"We will be on our trip three weeks longer. We arrive in Kingston March 15th. Will write again."

Mrs. Rogers, whose home is in Little Rock, is a frequent visitor in the city as the guest of her sister-in-law, Mrs. Ada Rogers German, at her home on Franklin Avenue.
