

It was under his leadership that the first church building was erected in Kannapolis.

The Textile World makes report that new business is not being placed in large quantities on any class of cotton goods. Many mills, it says, have a satisfactory volume of orders for the next few months, however, though the situation continued tather spotty. Ginghams and percales of well known mills continue to lag behind scheduled deliveries, indicating the extent of the improvement that has been made by these fabrics.

The primary influence on the goods market from now on until the end of the Summer will be the development of the new cotton crop. It is fairly well established that a slightly larger acreage will be planted this year than last, but even another crop as large as that of 1924 should not cause cotton prices to much below present quotations.


