TWO STEWARTS ADMIT THEY KILLED OFFICERS

Charles W. Shot Deputy Marshal Lilly and His Son Killed Leon George. Wilmington, April 15.—Charles W. Stewart, 51, admits he killed city Detective Leon George. Elmer Stewart, 23, son of C. W. Stewart, admits he murdered Deputy United States Marshal Samuel Lilly, the officers having been slain in Bobs branch, Brunswick county, July 31.

Unimpeachable information was received in Wilmington this afternoon that both defendants confessed to the murders yesterday morning at 8 o'clock, at the state prison, according to a story in the News-Dispatch this afternoon.

They meant to kill one or both of the officers when they left Chinins' store for the scene of the killing, both admitted. The elder Stewart in his confession admitted he used an old pistol in killing Leon George. Elmer, according to his confession, used a shot gun, in taking the life of Samuel Lilly.

Confessions of Two Men Are Made to Mr. Sink. Raleigh, April 15.—Charles W. Stewart and his son, Elmer, under sentence of electrocution, while the Governor was considering their case yesterday made a complete confession to Pardon Commissioner Sink of the crime for which they were condemned to die, it was learned here this afternoon.

That the men had confessed was stated today in Wilmington by lawyers who had represented them in their appeal for executive clemency and this was later confirmed at the capitol. It was added that the governor had been searching for some way in which he could conscientiously commute the sentence, especially that of the younger Stewart, when the confession was made.

In the absence of the governor from the capitol it was impossible to learn why the confessions were not made public yesterday afternoon when he announced his decision not to extend clemency in the case. Pardon Commissioner Sink merely confirmed the statement made by attorneys for the condemned men that they had confessed but declined to give details of the confession. It was understood that the governor, for some reason which was not disclosed, did not wish the confession to be published at this time.

The condemned men have signed a statement which is to be made public after their execution on Friday and it is believed that this is their confession of the crime. The men were convicted of the murder of Leon George and Sam Lilly in Brunswick county. An appeal from the Superior court decision resulted in an affirmation of the sentence by the Supreme court and the denial of clemency by the governor closed the door of hope to the two men.

Billy Sunday Ready For Winston Meeting. Winston-Salem, April 15.—Billy Sunday, the noted evangelist, who will begin a six week's meeting here next Sunday, was in New York today, and will visit Raleigh, Durham and Friday, while en route to this city. He will stop in Washington and have lunch with President Coolidge, according to information received here today by a representative of the Sunday party. Billy and "Ma Sunday" will arrive here Saturday.
