### LOUIS PECK IS NOW RESIDENT ENGINEER

Takes the Place of F. S. Klutz, Who Goes to Charlotte on Mt. Holly Project.

Louis Peck, son of Mr. and Mrs. C. H. Peck, of this city, has been transferred by the State Highway Commission from the District Office in Charlotte, to Concord, where he is taking the place of F. S. Klutz as resident engineer of this county.

Mr. Klutz, who has held the position in the county for over a year, has been sent to Charlotte where he has charge of the project of constructing the highway from Charlotte to Mt. Holly.

Mr. Peck is a graduate of State College at Raleigh and after completing his course worked in Raleigh for over a year, working in the State Highway offices there during his stay. He was then transferred to Charlotte and has been there for several years.

The State Highway Commission is at present engaged in completing the Mt. Pleasant project. It has been finished to a place within two miles of Mt. Pleasant and the work at present is being done to complete the road through that town and on to the limits of the county.

### Tent Meeting in Rear of City Hall

Evangelist W. F. LaRowe is in Concord to open a big revival in a gospel tent one block from the court house.

Mr. LaRowe has evangelized all over the United States and comes highly recommended by men of all walks of life.

### CONCORD PARTY IN AUTO ACCIDENT TO RETURN TODAY

**Alleged Drunken Driver Said to Have Caused Wreck of Car Belonging to C. W. Jenkins.**

The condition of Mr. and Mrs. C. W. Jenkins and children and Miss Alma Goode, who were injured Sunday afternoon in an automobile wreck near Statesville, is very much improved and it is thought that they will return to Concord this afternoon.

The following is an account of the accident as published in the Statesville Daily:

Mr. and Mrs. C. W. Jenkins and two children and Miss Alma Goode, of Concord, spent yesterday in Statesville with friends and all were more or less hurt and bruised when their car was wrecked. The party had started home late in the afternoon. Just after they had crossed the bridge at Kerr's branch, a man, supposed to be named Love, and going in the same direction, drove against the Jenkins car, forcing it off the road and against the embankment, where it turned over. One of the Jenkins children, a little girl, suffered a broken collar bone; Mr. Jenkins was badly cut on one hand and the other occupants of the car were bruised and shocked. Mr. Lee S. Folger, of Charlotte, who happened along at the time, brought the wounded to Long's Sanatorium, where all received medical attention. After this they spent the night at the home of Mr. W. M. Barringer and it is expected they will be able to go home today.

It is alleged that Love was under the influence of whiskey and did not stop when the wreck occurred but kept on going until he wrecked his own car, some distance farther on, and was arrested. He will be given a hearing at Mooresville today.

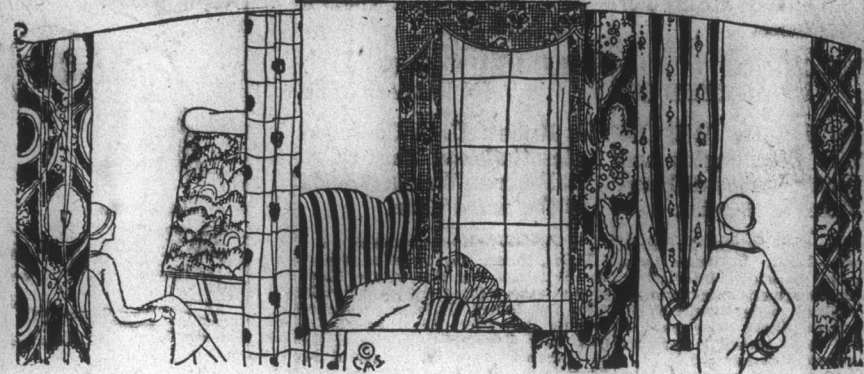
