LOCAL MENTION

Mrs. Lindsay Ross is moving today from her house on Loan street to her new quarters on Church street in the house owned by Miss Lucy Richmond Lentz.

Frank Mund, building inspector for the city, reports that he issued 22 building permits during May for work valued at \$34,500.

The county commissioners are holding their June meeting at the court house today. The first session was held this morning, but so far as is known no matters of unusual importance were presented to the commissioners at the session.

Ross Ritchie, son of Mr. and Mrs. John H. Ritchie of this city, who is a student at the Lutheran Theological Seminary in Columbia, S. C., preached at Vespers Service last night at St. James Lutheran Church.

Miss Maude Brown, president of the local chapter American Legion Auxiliary, reports that the organization sent a check for \$10 to the relief fund being raised for the widows and orphans of the men killed in the mine explosion near Sanford.

Two changes in the schedule of Southern Railway trains became effective at 12:01 o'clock Sunday morning, and under the change northbound train No. 136 passes Concord at 5:05 a. m. and southbound train No. 35 passes Concord at 10:06 p. m. instead of 10:12 p. m.

According to a deed filed Saturday B. L. Umberger and W. C. Houston have sold to W. H. Cox property on West Buffalo street for \$1,500. Another deed filed Saturday records the sale of property in the county by Will M. Hurllocker to L. K. Hurllocker for \$250.

The county board of education is meeting today in the office of Prof. J. B. Robertson, secretary to the board. The financial budget for the year for the schools will be adopted at the meeting, which may continue late into the afternoon.

Summer temperatures bore down on Concord yesterday and today, driving away all doubt as to whether or not summer is here. The mercury climbed to a point near 90 degrees yesterday afternoon and there has been little change today.

W. L. Morris returned Saturday from the Charlotte Sanatorium, where he recently underwent a very serious operation. Mr. Morris' condition continues to show improvement and he is now able to sit up for a short period of time each day.

Only five cases are to be tried in recorder's court this afternoon, police officers stated this morning. Two of the defendants are charged with speeding, two with intoxication and disorderly conduct and the other with carrying a concealed weapon. The docket is unusually light for Monday.

A. S. Webb, superintendent of the local schools, is in Salisbury this afternoon to be present at the laying of the corner-stone of the new High School building which is being constructed in that city. The new building is to be one of the handsomest of its kind in the state.

Craig Stratford, twelve year old son of John W. Stratford, a student in the sixth grade at No. 2 school, was awarded the \$5 prize offered by the Yorke & Wadsworth Co. for the best composition on "Pets." Announcement of the award was made at the commencement exercises held at the school last Thursday night.

Brown's Clothing store is today moving to its new quarters on North Union street. The room, formerly occupied by the Musette, is in the Cannon Building and has been thoroughly remodeled, making it one of the best in the city. Manager Jack Brown expects to have all the work of transferring his goods completed by Wednesday morning.

The appeal for relief of the Coal Glen disaster which was made this morning by Rev. W. A. Jenkins, local chairman of the Red Cross, is already bringing in subscriptions, according to Mr. Jenkins. The first payment toward this fund was made by A. F. Hartsell who gave \$5 for the sufferers.

Although Dazzy Vance allowed but five hits and fanned 13 batters, he was defeated by the Giants yesterday 2 to 0 while Chicago was winning from Pittsburgh and St. Louis was defeating Cincinnati. In the American League Washington defeated Philadelphia, Boston defeated New York, St. Louis defeated Chicago and Cleveland defeated Detroit.

Peter DePaolo, one of the fastest drivers in the races held recently at Charlotte, won the race classic at Indianapolis Saturday. By winning the race DePaolo won about \$37,000. Benie Hill, who also ran well at Charlotte, was second in the race. More than 150,000 fans, said to be a record in America, saw the races.

The United Daughters of the Confederacy have been held Tuesday, June 9th at the Y. M. C. A. At this time the anniversary of Jefferson Davis' birthday which is June 3rd, will be observed. Also the 62nd anniversary of the greatest cavalry fight of the Civil War. The Confederate Veterans will be special guests of the Daughters.

Reports current here yesterday afternoon told of a very serious accident on the Concord-Charlotte road, but particulars of the accident cannot be secured. No injured persons were brought to the local hospital during the afternoon, it was reported at the hospital this morning, and no one seems to know anything definite about where the rumor originated.

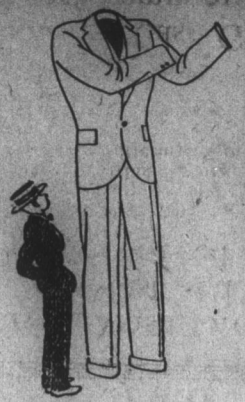

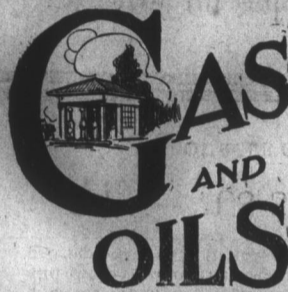

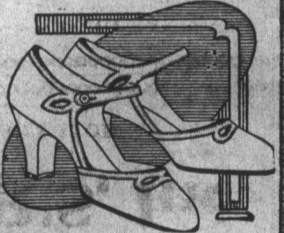
