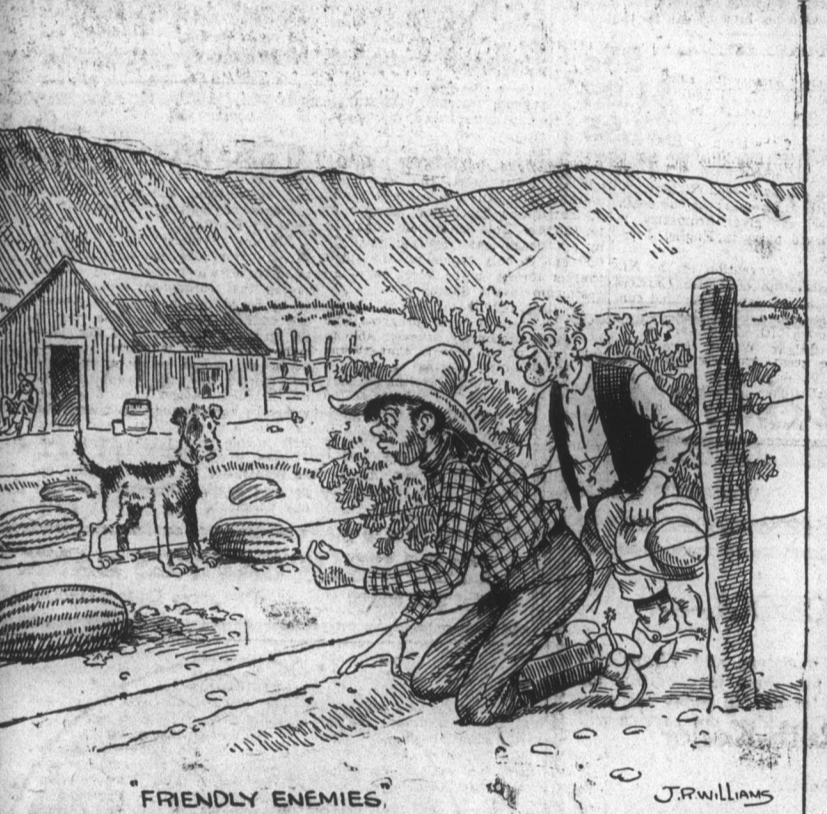

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Stewart's Washington Letter

WASHINGTON — Washington has an idea that Vice President Dawes will come back for the next session of Congress considerably chastened.

His demand for a change of the Senate rules has been staid up here, all along, as a bid for the reputation of a regular "heiler"—a chap who jumped right into the midst of a bad situation, which others had deplored for years without being able to do anything about it, and straightened it out in 48 hours.

Very few politicians believe Dawes cared much about the Senate rules, in and for themselves, one way or the other. They think he simply wanted to create a sensation by doing something strenuous, and the Senate rules were handy.

THE trouble is, the vice president's performance requires a climax, in order to be impressive, and there isn't going to be any. That's generally agreed. Nor, up to date, has it proved a particularly popular attraction.

The public hasn't "enthused" over it, it certainly makes no hit among the senators, and President Coolidge, and his advisors regard it with cold indifference. They don't like Dawes very well anyway.

Senator Moses' estimate that 21 is the maximum number of votes the Dawes scheme will get, is considered here to be high, if any thing.

"Now here is something that I wish to emphasize. What is an unbiased presentation of the news worth to the world? To do his part in a constituent democracy, a citizen needs and must have information on which he can base his own conclusions and actions.

The Associated Press helps men read correctly the facts and then to think straight and act wisely. He is the better informed and therefore the better established by reason of the facts, as against partisan propaganda.

The Associated Press is a cooperative organization of persons representing more than 1,200 newspapers, evening and Sunday papers, having for its purpose the collection and distribution of important news of the world. Bear in mind the membership is personal.

The Associated Press has its own leased wires forming a network of the continent. The total mileage is approximately: Day wires, 43,000 miles; night wires, 50,000 miles.

From various points along the trunk lines, the reports are sent to adjacent cities. The membership spreads from Alaska to Argentina; and from the Philippines to Porto Rico. Each member of the Associated Press engages to report the news of his immediate vicinity. More than 75,000 words are transmitted daily at all of the important offices, being equivalent of sixty columns of the average newspaper.

There are no "franchises"; the proper term is membership. It is a simple statement to say that the Associated Press does for its 1,200 papers what a reporter does for his individual paper. The A. P. covers the world as its territory. To collect this news and deliver it to the member newspapers the A. P. uses telegraph, telephone, cable, wireless, and the mails. In its direct operations it expends \$7,000,000 yearly, derived from assessments upon the members, while members themselves, who make this news available, expend for more than that sum for collecting the days news for you.

Nothing is reported by the Associated Press unless it happens. This statement means more than the "reader realizes. The organization gathers facts only; it does not guess or surmise. It is cautious and conservative. It has no opinion of its own and does not seek to express an opinion. It is reliable for facts, and what the A. P. says happened really happened just as reported.

Often a reader sending something from other sources writes a confirmation by the A. P. before accepting it as a fact.
