What is claimed to be the largest watermelon grown in the county this season was brought to Concord this morning by John R. Blackwelder, of No. 8 township. It weighed 70 pounds.

G. D. Grimes and R. M. Cline have sold to J. C. Taylor property in this county for \$700, according to a deed filed Thursday. Another deed records the sale of property near Glass by M. L. Hill to Mrs. Ola Hayr.

Manager Meriwether, of the Concord Theatre, announces that he will honor the Merchants' Free Tickets every day next week except Saturday. Hereafter, these tickets were only honored on Thursdays and Fridays.

Three cases are to be tried in police court this afternoon, officers stated this morning. One defendant is charged with passing a worthless check, another with operating a car without a State license and the other with operating an automobile without a muffler.

Pittsburgh strengthened its lead in the National League Thursday by defeating Boston while New York was losing to Cincinnati. In the American League Washington was defeated while Philadelphia was idle.

Dr. T. N. Spencer, secretary of the Cabarrus County Fair, states that all space in the auto exhibit for the fair has been sold. "We expect this exhibit to be one of the biggest and most interesting in the fair, since latest models of many makes of cars are to be shown for the benefit of the public," Dr. Spencer said.

The street sweeper has ceased operations for the present. It takes hundreds of gallons of water to operate the sweeper and its sprinkler and due to the scarcity of water it has been decided to eliminate the sweeper's schedule. The sweeper will not go back on duty until the water situation here is improved.

Mr. and Mrs. W. M. Sherrill went to Lexington this afternoon to spend a short while with Judge John M. Oglesby, who is presiding at sessions of Davidson County Superior Court this week. Judge Oglesby expects to return to Concord tomorrow when work of the court has been completed. He will spend the week-end here.

The second game of the Kannapolis-Gibson series is being played in Kannapolis this afternoon and many fans from here have gone up to witness it. Local mills are standing this afternoon due to a power shortage and many employees of the mills seized this opportunity to see the game between the Cabarrus county rivals.

Various advertisements for the Cabarrus County Fair have been distributed within the past two weeks. Bicycle streamers, auto pennants, road signs, banners and other signs calculated to catch the eye have been distributed in great quantities. It is planned to advertise the fair in all parts of the State.

Local cotton mills ceased operations for the week at noon today, under the curtailed power schedule of the Southern Power Co. Mills in the county were asked to stand from noon today until noon tomorrow, but as work in the mills is always halted at noon Saturday, the plants will not begin operations again until Monday morning. All of the mills in the county are affected.

Just what result the coal strike will have on coal prices is not known by local coal dealers, one of them stated this morning. "The price of coal has already advanced from 50 cents to 75 cents at the mines" one dealer said, "but the strike has not caused this." It is a fact that coal prices advance about this season each year, but when the strike comes it is believed prices will go beyond the average.
