Arrangements have been made to get the returns of the Carolina-State football game and also the returns of the Washington-Pittsburgh game at the fair this afternoon. The announcements will be made by the official starter.

L. B. Baldwin, Jr., died at the home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. J. B. Baldwin, at 1 o'clock yesterday afternoon. Funeral services were held this afternoon at 3 o'clock at the home conducted by Rev. M. L. Keister; and interment was made in Oakwood cemetery. The child was 3 years old.

Fewer persons than usual left today for Raleigh to attend the State Fair and also to see the State-Carolina football game which is to be played this afternoon. A number of fans who had made plans to go, decided not to try the trip when the weather was so unfavorable last night.

Arthur Allman, arrested here this week on a charge of possessing liquor and having liquor for sale, has been bound over to Superior Court. It is charged that officers took three plants of liquor from Allman's person. He could not raise bond in the sum of \$300.

Two Sunday School Institutes will be held on Sunday, October 18th. At 3:45 o'clock, No. 8 Township Institute will be held at Trinity Lutheran Church in Mt. Pleasant. Number 9 Township Institute will meet on the same afternoon at 2:30 o'clock at Cold Springs Church.

Farmers as a whole were glad to see the rain Tuesday night and yesterday. The rain was especially well received by those persons whose wells and springs had been affected by the drought and who have been hauling water. Local streams show no rise as a result of the rain.

One of the biggest football games of the year in Mt. Pleasant is being played in Raleigh this afternoon between State and Carolina. The Tribune has made arrangements to get the score by quarts, the results to be posted at the office. The two teams entered the game about evenly matched, judging by recent games played by them.

Congressman R. L. Doughton, of Sparta, spent Wednesday afternoon in Concord on business, leaving last night for his home. Mr. Doughton has been called to Washington to a meeting of the Ways and Means Committee, which has its first sessions on Friday. This committee is one of the most important in Congress.

Quite a number of local business houses were closed this afternoon to give their employees opportunity to spend half-holiday at the fair. Dr. T. N. Spencer, Secretary of the fair, asked the merchants to give the half-holiday and approval of his suggestion was given by O. A. Swearingen, president of the Merchants' Association.

The Citizens Bank and Trust Company, commissioner, has sold to J. W. Stallings for \$2,000 property in the county bordering on the Charlotte-Albemarle highway, according to a deed filed yesterday. Another deed filed records the sale of land in No. 4 township by P. G. Glass to Jos. D. Glass for \$100.

Five auto casings, nine inner tubes and nine boxes of chewing tobacco, identified as part of the goods stolen recently from the store of Cochrane & Brown, at the Roberta Mill, have been found in a patch of woods near Poplar Tent Church. It is said that no one knows yet who placed the goods in the woods.

For larceny and forcible trespass a man was fined \$25 and given a six month suspended sentence in recorder's court yesterday. Another defendant charged with being intoxicated was fined \$10 and another, charged with abandonment, was fined \$200. He was given until Monday to raise the money or serve six months on the chain gang.

NAME OF BISHOP BROWN TAKEN FROM CHURCH ROLL

Service Depositing the Bishop on Heresy Charge Is Brief. New Orleans, Oct. 12.—The name of William Montgomery Brown was ordered removed from the list of bishops when the house of bishops of the Protestant Episcopal Church assembled in general convention here. The Most Rev. Ethelbert Talbot, presiding bishop, announced at the opening of the house that he had deposed Bishop Brown "from the sacred ministry" in St. Paul's church a few minutes before.

Bishop Brown, who resigned as bishop of Arkansas in 1912, had been convicted of heresy by a church court, his conviction was sustained by a court of review and finally approved by the house of bishops. Today for-

Bishop Brown did not appear in St. Paul's church to hear the sentence, though his attorneys obtained from United States Judge Louis H. Burns "show cause" order requiring the presiding bishop and the house of bishops to appear in federal court Wednesday morning to show their authority for action in the case of the convicted bishop. George Zahrickie, New York chancellor, will appear for the bishops. The deposition ceremony was brief, barely ten minutes being required for the presiding bishop to read the sentence.
