LOCAL MENTION

A record attended the Brown Mill moving pictures at their initial showing last night. The Y. M. C. A. plans to present movies each week at this place.

Delegates to the State U. D. C. convention in Elizabeth City voted Thursday to meet next year in Fayetteville. The sessions of the convention came to a close shortly after the 1926 meeting place was selected.

Thirty-three white schools of the county will open Monday, it is reported at the office of Prof. J. B. Robertson, county superintendent of schools. At the same time, it is reported, most of the 25 colored schools began work several weeks ago.

Announcement has been made in connection with the Halloween celebration that the Mooresville band, a seven-piece organization, has been secured to play here for the festivities, including the old-fashioned square dance at the Y. M. C. A. that night.

There will be no preaching services in Central Methodist Church Sunday evening. The congregation of this church has been invited to worship at the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church, where a series of meetings is being held now, and the invitation has been accepted.

A Sunday School Institute for No. 5 township will be held Sunday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock in Gilead Church, officers of the county Sunday School Association announce. Departmental secretaries of the county association will have charge of the program, and the general public is invited.

Hundreds of local football fans plan to go to Charlotte tomorrow to see the Davidson-Furman game, which will begin at 3 o'clock at Wear Field. The two teams are evenly matched, according to present score for the year, and the game promises to be one of the best in the state this year.

DETECTIVE DISMISSED

Beats Up Two Chapel Hill Boys in Using Third Degree. Durham, Oct. 22.—A. W. Allison who has held a position as detective with the Durham police department for a long while was tonight dismissed from the service by the city manager following a brutal attack which he is alleged to have made upon two Chapel Hill youth, Thomas Brockwell, aged 18, and Ezra McFarland, aged 20, after the pair had been taken to the police station last night by the detective and Police Sergeant Larkin Woods to be quizzed regarding the theft of parts from an automobile.

The facts in the assault came up before Recorder Graham this afternoon when Brockwell and McFarland were arraigned on a charge of larceny and when they informed the court that Allison had beaten one of them with a beard and the other with a leather belt in an effort to force them to acknowledge the theft of the parts from the car which had been robbed. Scars and bruises were found on the bodies of the two youths. Warrants charging Allison with assault and battery were at once issued at the suggestion of Prosecuting Attorney W. B. Umstead and the detective was tried, found guilty and fined \$50 and costs in one case and \$25 and costs in the other. He gave notice of appeal and Sheriff John Harward stood his bond.

The affair created such a sensation following the making public of the details that Chief of Police Doby immediately gave out a statement to the effect that he would recommend the immediate and permanent dismissal of the detective. This was done and tonight the city manager had discharged him, once and for all. The occurrence, so far as is known, is the first of its sort ever to happen in the Durham police department. Chief Doby gave out a statement tonight to the effect that he disapproved of such third degree methods and had warned all officers regarding the same and that no man could be a member of the force and practice such. Allison, it is understood that civil suits are to be immediately filed against him by the parents of the two young men whom he attacked.

Many Herds of Cattle Tested. Raleigh, Oct. 23.—(AP)—Three thousand six hundred and nine herds of cattle were tested for tuberculosis during the month of September in North Carolina, a summary of the tuberculosis eradication work in the various states, compiled by the bureau of animal industry of the United States department of agriculture, and just received here, shows. The total number of cattle tested during the month in this state was 8,411. Of this number 35 cattle are reported to have reacted to the test.
