Receipts at the Halloween carnival, which was held Friday afternoon and night at the Y. M. C. A., netted \$112.90, which was slightly less than the expenses for the affair. Rain prevented many of the people from attending who would otherwise have gone.

Mr. and Mrs. Farrell White spent the week-end in Asheville with the former's father, E. F. White, who is undergoing treatment in an Asheville hospital for rheumatism and nervousness. Mr. White's condition is regarded as slightly improved at present.

Western North Carolina, from Asheville to Stateville, was visited by a steady, consistent rain Sunday. The rain began falling in Asheville late Saturday night, say reports reaching Concord, and fell without interruption throughout Sunday. If the rain will continue for several days, it is said, the power situation in this section may be improved.

R. P. Benson, who suffered a paralytic stroke at his home here several weeks ago, resumed his duties at the Time-Tribune office this morning. The Department of Commerce through the Census Bureau, states that 10,328 bales of cotton were ginned in Cabarrus county prior to October 25th, this year, compared with 4,448 bales to the same time last year. Johnston county with 47,698 bales ginned prior to October 26th led the state this year, with Robeson, with 42,792 bales second. In the state this year 711,688 bales were ginned compared with 192,800 bales last year.

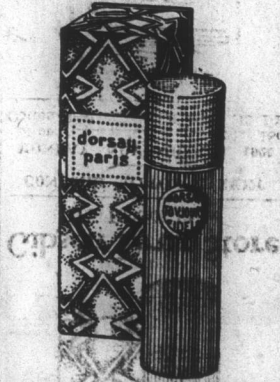
