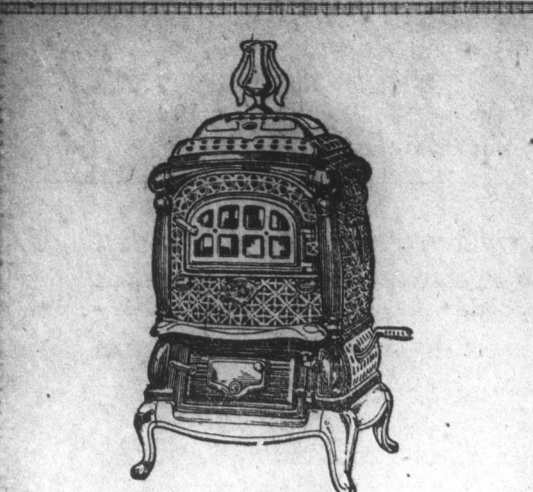

Present indications point to a record crowd at Chancel Hill Thanksgiving for the Carolina-Virginia game. Several score of Concord people have secured tickets for the game and others expect to get their tickets between now and Thanksgiving.
The attendance at the prayer breakfast Sunday morning promises to be good, according to Y. M. C. A. officials who are pushing this breakfast as the beginning to the week of prayer. Short prayer services will be held each morning during the remainder of the week at 8 o'clock.

Hoyle Sink, pardon commissioner for North Carolina, passed through Concord early this morning. He was en route to an adjoining county to make an investigation for Governor McLean of the case of a man who is scheduled to be electrocuted tomorrow.
Everything is said to be in readiness for the November meeting of the board of aldermen at the city hall tonight. The aldermen expect to begin the meeting at 8 o'clock and as several matters of interest will be presented the session promises to be an important one.

Moving pictures will be shown tonight at Brown Mill hall by the Y. M. C. A. movie force. The inmates of the county home will also be shown a few films Friday evening. The Y. M. C. A. moving picture machine is in use practically every night in the week.
A number of Duke alumni plan to go to Durham Saturday for a gathering of former students of the university. A feature of the day will be a memorial service to the late James B. Duke, and in the afternoon the annual Duke-Wake Forest football game will be played.

The new Charlotte municipal building was formally opened last night and a number of Concord firemen and private citizens motored over to inspect the building and enjoy the attractive program arranged. All were impressed with the arrangement and beauty of the building.

Persons receiving premium money from the Cabarrus Fair in some instances do not understand the rules governing the prizes, judging from inquiries received by fair officials. It is pointed out by officials that where there is no competition first premium money is not given. First prize ribbons and second premium money are given in such cases.

Relatives here have been advised that the apartment in Atlanta occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Charles H. Wadsworth, was destroyed by fire Tuesday evening. Mr. and Mrs. Wadsworth were able to save only a few pieces of clothing, they have advised relatives. Full particulars of the fire were not given.

Twenty-five of the older boys, under the chaperonage of Harry Lee Johnson and Rev. R. S. Arrowood, will attend the Saturday and Sunday sessions of the Older Boys' conference which is being held at the Y. M. C. A. at Salisbury on Friday, Saturday and Sunday of this week. The Concord party will leave here Saturday and remain over until the close of the conference.

Dr. W. S. Rankin, formerly head of the Health Department in North Carolina and at present connected with the management of the Duke Endowment, plans to move his family to Charlotte in the near future. Dr. Rankin spent Wednesday here with his brothers, Dr. S. W. and Dr. R. B. Rankin, and was a speaker at the weekly meeting of the Concord Rotary Club.
