Overhanging clouds bring threat of more rain for Concord. Rising temperatures came with the clouds and there are indications now that the week-end will be wet like most of them have been this month. Warmer weather is predicted for tonight with possible showers.

Raleigh News and Observer: Cabarrus gave the State a useful and patriotic Senator in W. A. Felt yesterday. He has a host of friends, particularly his associates in the General Assembly, who esteemed him highly. He was a delegate to the National Democratic Convention in 1924.

C. N. Fields, city tax collector, is preparing to add a penalty to all city taxes not paid by December first. The tax books have been open for several weeks and while a number of people have paid hundreds of others have not. Announcement of the penalty was made in The Daily Tribune this week by Mr. Field.

Two persons were tried in recorder's court yesterday. One man paid a fine of \$10 for being intoxicated and Julia Martin was sentenced to serve 6 months for violating the prohibition law. The court was advised by officers that they found a quantity of liquor in the woman's home here Sunday night.

Many farmers in Concord now are complaining about hunters running over their lands. It is known that hundreds of land poisoning notices have been sold in Concord during the past several weeks, the farmers declaring they would not object to the hunters if they would only act reasonable. It is said that rabbits and quail both are being killed now.

Approaches to the side of the Concord-Charlotte road are being built up again now. State highway forces have been engaged in this work for some time and good progress is being made now that rains are coming with regularity. It was practically impossible to do much during the drought but substantial sides are now being built along the entire highway from this city to Charlotte.

Chief of Police Talbirt made contractors on the hotel job move from Union street a big pile of sand which was piled up yesterday afternoon. The sand was practically across the entire street when Chief Talbirt advised the contractors that it would have to be moved. Chief Talbirt stated that he wanted to aid the contractors in any way possible but that materials could not be so placed as to block traffic.

Concord Presbytery to Meet in Mooresville Next Week.

An adjourned meeting of Concord Presbytery will be held in the First Presbyterian Church here on next Tuesday November 24th, at 3 o'clock P. M. At that time Rev. W. E. West will formally present his resignation as pastor of Prospect and Centre Presbyterian Churches, to accept work as pastor of the church at Southport in the Wilmington Presbytery. Rev. E. M. Craig, of Hickory, will also present his resignation at that time. He expects to become Superintendent of Home Missions in the Synod of Appalachia. Any other business that may come before the Presbytery will be attended to.

A 614 Pound Porker.

Stanley News Herald. Mr. E. R. Hatley, of North Fifth street, killed a young porker last week which netted 614 pounds of pork. The pig was only 16 months old. Mr. Hatley is known in this county as one of the "heavy pork raisers," but he says this is the biggest one he has yet killed.
