Wickersham today in addressing the final session of the jurist's charged by the league with codifying international law. The jurists adjourned to meet next autumn when they will discuss a new list of subjects.

The American delegate said the more he participated in league meetings, the more respect he had for the league, and the more he was convinced that the league afforded tremendous aid in the conduct of all international relations.
