The Georgia peach season for 1926 was opened Sunday morning when two cars were forwarded from Atlanta to New York via the Southern Railway. The two cars reached Monroe, Va., 163 miles south of Washington, ahead of schedule Monday morning. At Potomac Yards, Va., they will be delivered to The Pennsylvania Railroad and will be moved out early Tuesday morning, reaching New York in time for market Wednesday morning. Both cars were loaded Saturday on the Central of Georgia Railroad in the Fort Valley District, were delivered to the Southern at Atlanta early Sunday morning and iced at Imman Yards, the principal clearing house for Georgia peaches moving to Northern markets.
